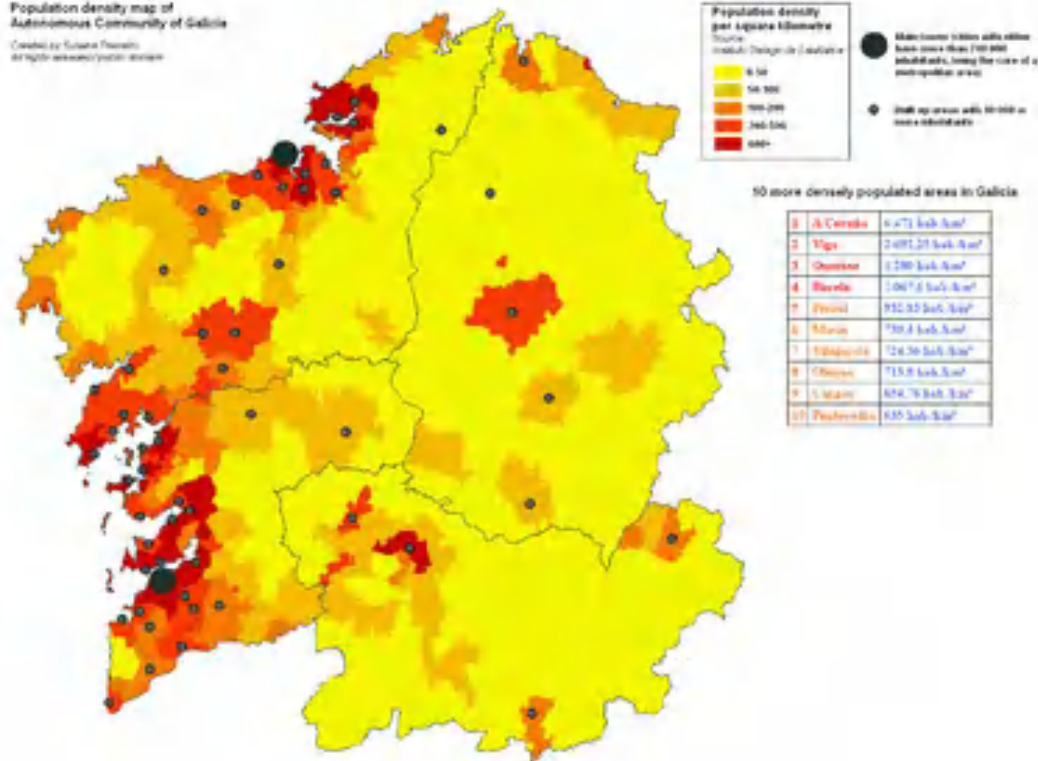

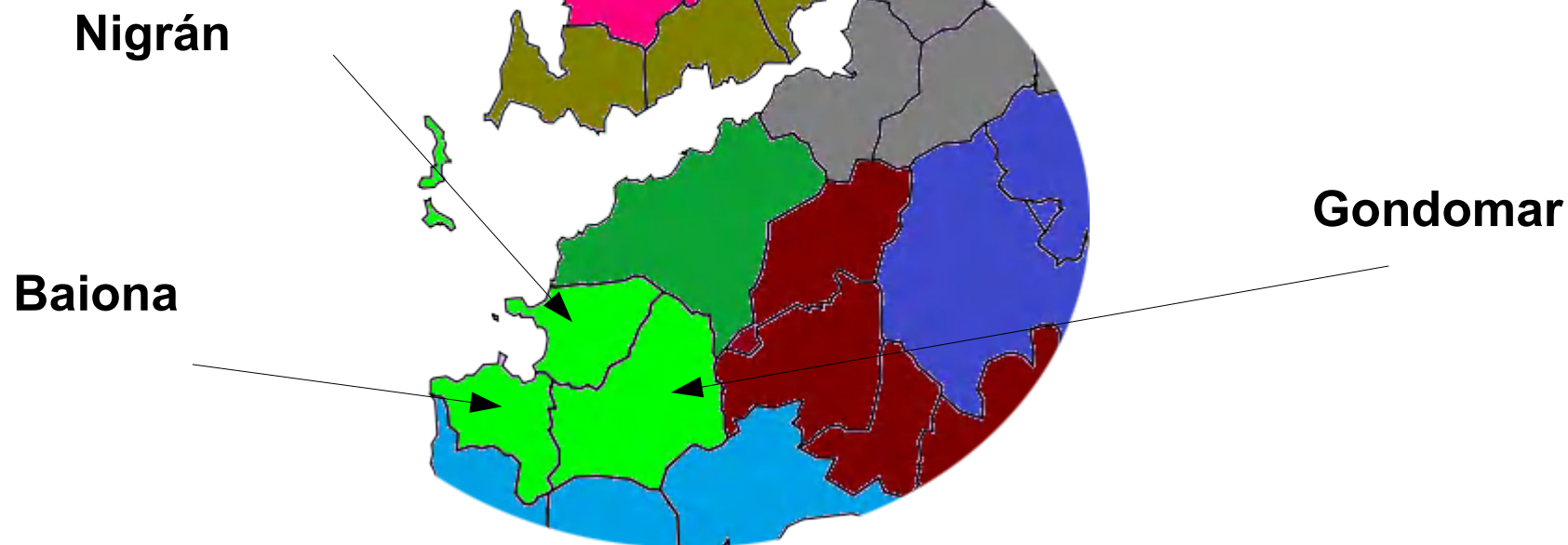
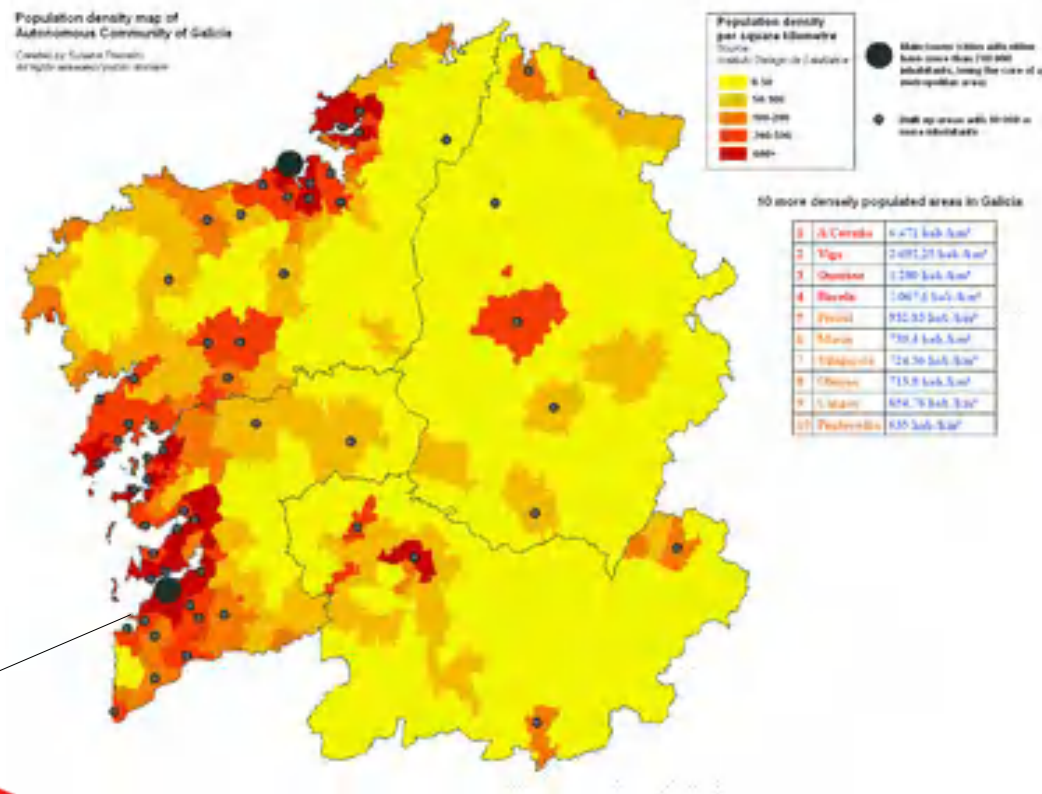


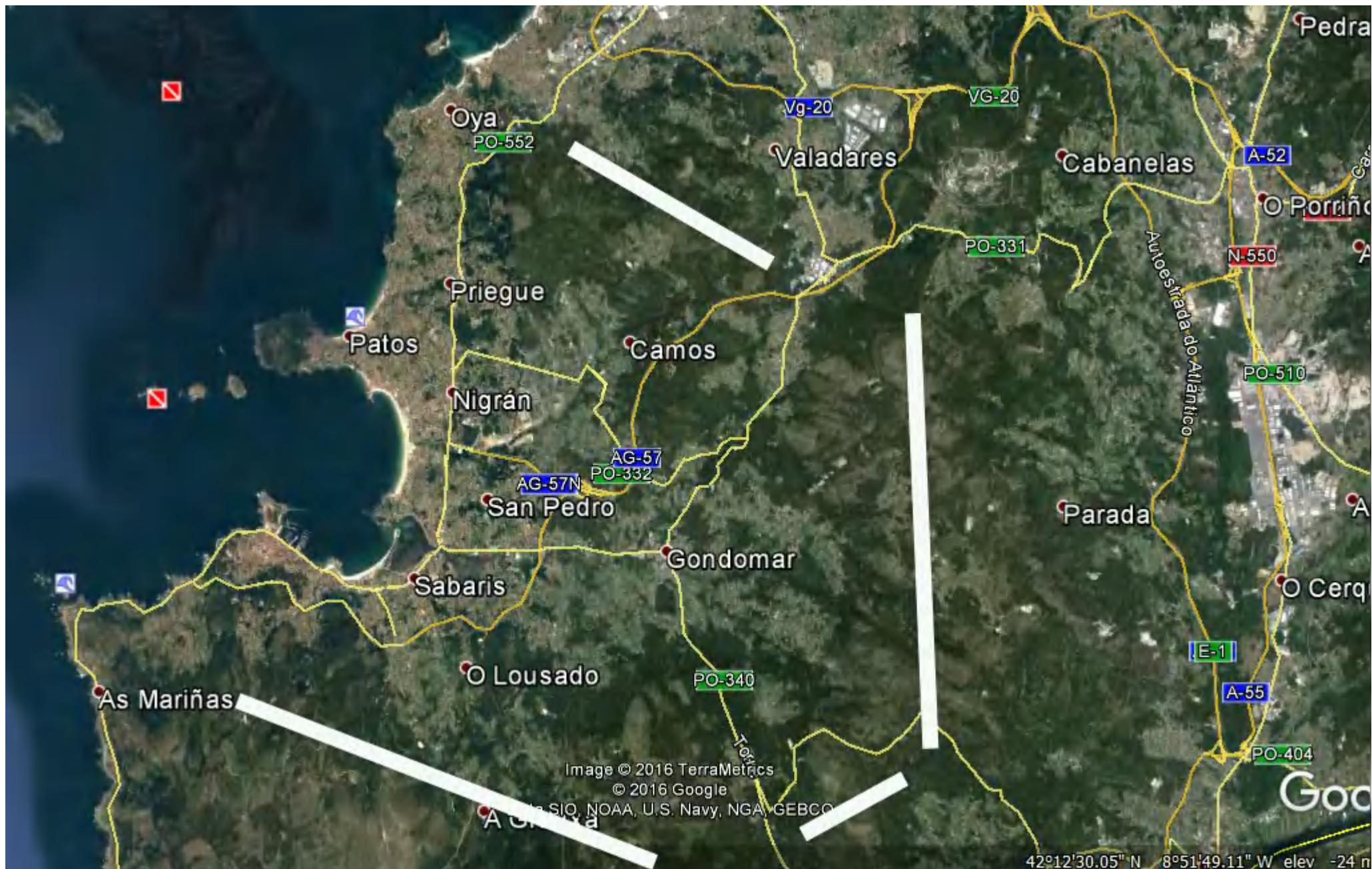
Population density map of
